# POLICE REPORT

Along with our regular traffic enforcement duties, the RCMP and SGI are partnering each month of the year to concentrate extra focus on one area of traffic safety for enforcement purposes. The month of **JULY** will see us place extra focus on **WORK ZONES**.

Year round in Saskatchewan there are roads being repaired and maintained. To keep everybody safe, you must follow some important guidelines when you encounter work zones. Work zones generally have clear signage, with orange signs indicating you are entering a road construction area and black and white signs for speed.

These signs follow a general pattern:

- An orange sign stating "workers present"
- A black and white sign saying 60 km/hr. At this point you are legally required to slow to 60 km/hr
- At the end of the work area an "end of work area" sign will be present to signal the end of the work zone. It will be followed by a black and white sign indicating the regular speed limit. You are not permitted to return to the regular speed limit until you pass this sign.

If you don't slow down, you are putting workers and yourself at risk. Further, you face elevated fines that increase as your speed increases. The base fine is \$210, plus a per km fine, plus a victim surcharge amount. For example, if you are travelling 70 km/hr in a construction zone (10 km over speed limit), your fine will be \$300. If you are travelling 80 km/hr (20 km over speed limit), your fine will be \$330. If you were to be travelling at 100 km/hr (40 km over limit) your fine would be \$530. If you are travelling 110 km/hr (50 km over limit) your fine would be \$714. The fines keep getting larger and larger.

Work zone signage on municipal and RM roads may differ slightly from the signage you see on this highway, but you are still required to slow to 60 km/hr when you enter the work area. A reminder that you must also slow to 60 km/hr when passing emergency vehicles (police / fire / ambulance) with their lights flashing, when passing tow trucks with their lights flashing and when passing Ministry of Highways workers with their lights flashing.

**REMINDER** as per **Bylaw 1/2015** of the Town of Willow Bunch – "No dog shall run at large in the Municipality, and for the purpose of this bylaw, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when it is beyond the boundaries of the land occupied by the owner, possessor, or harbourer of the dog, or beyond the boundaries of any lands where it may be with the permission of the owner or occupant of the said land and where it is not under the control by being:

- a) In direct and continuous charge of a person competent to control it; or
- b) Securely confined within an enclosure; or
- c) Securely fastened so that it cannot roam at will"

**This bylaw is not only for the safety of the citizens of the community but also for the animal's safety as well.**

## CRIMESTOPPERS

The Coronach/Bengough RCMP are investigating a Hit and Run that occurred on June 27, 2017 at 1:50pm on a grid road west of Coronach at the 9 mile road. A north bound tractor hauling a red implement (thought to be a swather) sideswiped a south bound tractor trailer unit. One of the tires and a rim on the tractor trailer unit was ruined. The suspect stopped a few hundred metres past the collision and checked his equipment, then got back into the tractor and fled the scene.

### **Bylaw 4/2017**

#### **Town of Willow Bunch**

#### **A Bylaw to Provide for Mobile Containers – Trailers, Sea and Rail Containers (Shipping Containers)**

The Council of the Town of Willow Bunch in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. That the town designates Parcel M Block 20 Plan 76MJ04889 for Shipping Containers.
2. That a fee for the shipping containers will be \$50/month.
3. No shipping containers may exceed 3 meters in height, 2.5 meters in width and 12.5 meters in length.
4. The shipping containers must be kept in a clean, orderly manner and placed on a level, secure surface.
5. Shipping containers are prohibited from being used as a dwelling. Shipping containers are prohibited from being plumbed or electrified in any manner.
6. Shipping containers may not be stacked and are prohibited from storage of junk, trash or other forms of refuse.
7. Shipping containers shall not be used for the purpose of display or advertising.
8. Containers determined by the Town to be unsightly, misused, unsafe, or inappropriate in anyway, must be removed at the owner's expense within a time period specified by the Town.

Read three times and adopted this 5<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2017.

**Sarah's Key**  
by Tatiana de Rosnay

Paris, July 1942: Sarah, a ten year-old girl, is brutally arrested with her family by the French police in the Vel' d'Hiv' roundup, but not before she locks her younger brother in a cupboard in the family's apartment, thinking that she will be back within a few hours. Paris, May 2002: On Vel' d'Hiv's 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary, journalist Julia Jarmond is asked to write an article about this black day in France's past. Through her contemporary investigation, she stumbles onto a trail of long-hidden family secrets that connect her to Sarah. Julia finds herself compelled to retrace the girl's ordeal, from that terrible term in the Vel' d'Hiv', to the camps, and beyond. As she probes into Sarah's past, she begins to question her own place in France, and to reevaluate her marriage and her life. Tatiana de Rosnay offers us a brilliantly subtle, compelling portrait of France under occupation and reveals the taboos and silence that surround this painful episode.

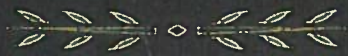
